Meeting New People, Making New Friends

During September, Faith hosted a Discerning Missional Leadership Assessment event. This event is for people who are discerning whether they are called to plant new churches. Starting a new church can be more than a little difficult, and it is truly a calling.

At lunch, one of the coordinators for the Discerning Missional Leadership Assessment event asked me, "What gives you joy right now?" I said without hesitation, "On an average day, I meet so many beautiful and fascinating people. I love that." I surprised myself with what I said and with the quickness of my response, but it is exactly how I feel.

While we have been reading *Together* by Dr. Vivek Murthy on Tuesday evenings, I have also found myself paying more attention to the reality of loneliness that encircles us every day. Loneliness touches all of us, and loneliness is one way our bodies tell us that we need human connection.

The covid pandemic limited in-person social interactions severely. With the pandemic in the rearview mirror, I have felt a new freedom to reach out and meet new people in person. This year, meeting new people and making new friends has been such a gift.

At the beginning of the year, I was invited to a gathering of pastors and activists. The gathering was at John Fanestil's house. John is the Executive Director of Via International, a non-profit that focuses on sustainable community development on both sides of the border. John visited Faith earlier in the year to share conversation with us about what is happening at the U.S./Mexico border right now. John recently wrote a book, American Heresy: The Roots and Reach of White Christian Nationalism, which is now available. I am grateful to know John.

A few weeks ago, we had a beehive and bees swarming in the preschool. The preschool director called a professional beekeeper, Quinten, to safely relocate the bees to a more appropriate location. I thoroughly enjoyed meeting Quinten and learning some of his story. He was an EMT before falling in love with bees and has been a beekeeper ever since. I am grateful to know him.

Last year, many of us at Faith read Michael Gaulden's book, My Way Home: Growing Up Homeless in America. In September Michael and his partner joined us for a worship service and talked with us after the worship service about his experience. Sharing the morning with him was a gift. I am grateful to know him.

There are also many new faces in our preschool, new staff, new families, and new student interns. While in the past we may have often thought of the church and preschool as separate communities, we are actually one non-profit organization. We are part of the same tree. There is so much opportunity for forming new relationships and friendships between church members and preschool staff and families. I am grateful to welcome all the new faces to our community on this campus.

The greatest gift I have received as moderator of San Diego Presbytery has been meeting people from around San Diego. We are encircled every day by so many beautiful and fascinating people.

Who is Faith Presbyterian Church? Faith is all of us, and the "us" can continue to expand as we meet new people and make new friends, as we continue to invite new friends into joy-filled circles of belonging.


THE ALL CHURCH CHRISTMAS DINNER IS ON





We meet on Tuesday at 7pm on Zoom.

From the back cover: "Loneliness is a root cause and contributor to many of the epidemics sweeping the world today – from alcohol and drug addiction to violence, depression, and anxiety. It affects not only our health but also how our children experience school, how we perform at work, and the sense of division and polarization in our society. Despite our progress in talking about mental health, we are still ashamed of feeling lonely. Dr. Murthy explores our need to belong what happens when we find ourselves untethered.

But there is hope in our true nature as social animals. Our desire to forge lasting bonds, help one another, and share life experiences also provides the starting point for curing this epidemic of loneliness. Together we are simply better. In *Together*, Dr. Murthy recounts inspiring and encouraging stories of individuals and communities that are making great strides in helping us understand that we are not alone and offers simple yet effective solutions we can use today to heal ourselves, one another, and build stronger communities. Told with great compassion and hope, Dr. Murthy makes a powerful and convincing argument for why we can and must build a more connected world."

From the back cover: "Vivek H. Murthy, MD, is the surgeon general of the United States. He received his bachelor's degree from Harvard and his MD and MBA from Yale. He completed his internal medicine residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Harvard Medical School, where he later joined the faculty. Dr. Murthy resides in Washington, DC, with his wife, Dr. Alice Chen, and their two children."


